One new positive COVID-19 case has been identified in Petersburg. The positive test result is travel related and was discovered as a result of a follow up test at the airport after intrastate travel. The person was isolating after travel and was asymptomatic. At the present time, this person continues to isolate is not a significant risk to Petersburg. Public health has been contacted to complete contact investigations.

This case will not affect the community risk level at this time and the current risk level is at Yellow (Low) for Petersburg.

It is advised that all travelers into Petersburg take a free follow up PCR test at the airport between 5 – 10 days after arrival, even if your initial travel testing is negative and you are asymptomatic.
