JOINT MEDIA RELEASE: COVID-19 | POSITIVE CASE FROM OUT OF STATE

One new positive test result for COVID-19 has been identified through the traveler testing site at the James A. Johnson Airport in Petersburg. The positive case was a visitor who tested negative upon their arrival to Petersburg on July 20th, but tested positive on a test taken on August 4th, the day they left the state. The person is no longer in the community and is considered to be recovered by the State of Alaska. The visitor did not have symptoms of COVID-19 upon their arrival to Alaska.

The Alaska Department of Epidemiology has begun a contact investigation to identify close contacts and begin isolation or quarantine of anyone that meets the criteria of a close contact. Information provided thus far indicates that close contacts are limited and that the risk to the community is low.

We want to reassure the public that we are working closely with the Alaska Division of Public Health to identify anyone who may be at risk for having contact with these individuals. We will keep the public informed of any information that is needed for community health and safety.

If you are not sick, please continue to take precautionary measures to stay healthy:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially
 after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose,
 coughing, or sneezing.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, or cough or sneeze into your elbow.
- Clean frequently touched surfaces and objects daily (e.g., tables, countertops, light switches, doorknobs, and cabinet handles) using a regular household detergent and water.
- Wear a mask when out in public when you cannot ensure six feet of social distancing as this could minimize the spread of COVID-19.
- Continue to socially distance. This means protecting you and your household members from getting sick. Avoid breaking your home bubble of protection.
- Monitor your health and that of your household members and call the COVID hotline with any questions.

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
