The COVID-19 dashboard has been updated based on information from Public Health:

Active cases: 8 Resident cases: 7 Non-resident cases: 1

Early recognition of symptoms improves outcome: Community spread is an ongoing concern and PMC encourages persons to be watchful of symptoms that are suggestive of COVID-19 and **test early**. Physicians have more treatment options when COVID-19 is diagnosed early in the course of the infection. Delays of greater than 5 days after symptoms develop may put patients at greater risk for more severe COVID. Early treatment options are more likely to have improved outcome (even with breakthrough infections). Patients who are high risk are particularly vulnerable to complications from serious COVID-19 illness.

Asymptomatic testing is available. Testing is strongly encouraged in everyone with symptoms, even if you are fully vaccinated. Asymptomatic testing is available and there is **no charge** for this test. Call the COVID Information Line at 907-772-5788.

There is community spread of COVID-19 in Petersburg. If you develop a fever and symptoms, such as fever, cough or difficulty breathing, call the Petersburg Medical Center COVID Information Line at 907-772-5788 before going to the hospital or clinic. You will be provided guidance by a medical professional.

Persons with severe symptoms requiring ambulance transport are asked to notify the 911 dispatcher that you have COVID-19 symptoms.

Take appropriate precautions to prevent the disease from spreading to people in your home and community. If you test positive, please cooperate with Public Health, your close contacts will be provided instructions to quarantine and monitor for symptoms. Telling your close contacts in advance of the Public Health call will greatly assist in controlling continued spread of COVID-19 in our community. Contact tracing is extremely important for preventing further spread of COVID-19.

What can you do? As cases continue to increase across Alaska and the Lower 48, follow the recommendations from the CDC:

- Continue to wear masks at public indoor locations, even if you have been vaccinated. Until researchers know more, it is possible the vaccine will protect you from getting sick but may not prevent you from spreading the virus to others.
- Continue to practice physical distancing and keep social circles small. Postpone indoor gatherings until a safer time.



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- Wash your hands often. Clean and sanitize common areas and surfaces.
- Get tested if you feel sick, if you have been exposed to COVID-19 and before and after you travel.

Vaccines: The COVID-19 vaccine provides good protection against serious COVID illness that results in hospitalization and death. Greater than 95% of the hospitalized patients in Alaska are not vaccinated. Vaccinations for people aged 12 and older may be scheduled by calling the COVID Information Line at 907-772-5788, option 4. People who are fully vaccinated and exposed to a positive case do not need to quarantine but do need to monitor for symptoms.
