PRESS RELEASE: On July 6th Petersburg Medical Center identified two positive COVID-19 cases in residents of Petersburg. Public Health has been notified and will commence contact tracing efforts.

People should monitor for symptoms after participation in large gathering events and if any symptoms develop, call the COVID Information Line at 907-772-5788. People concerned about exposure may receive testing for no charge by calling the same number.

Vaccines for COVID-19 provide good protection against serious COVID illness that results in hospitalization and death. Vaccinations for people aged 12 and older may be scheduled by calling the COVID Information Line at 907-772-5788. People who are fully vaccinated and exposed to a positive case do not need to quarantine but do need to monitor for symptoms.

COVID-19 mitigation to prevent community spread: If you are sick or suspect that you may be infected with the virus that causes COVID-19, you should take steps to prevent the disease from spreading to people in your home and community. If you think you have been exposed to COVID-19 and develop a fever and symptoms, such as fever, cough or difficulty breathing, call the Petersburg Medical Center COVID Information Line at 907-772-5788 for medical advice. Do not go to the hospital or clinic before calling the Information Line.
