For Immediate Release

Two new positive COVID-19 cases have been identified in a single household in Petersburg. The cases are close contacts of previous positive case and have been quarantining since the initial positive case in the household. Public health has been contacted to complete contact investigations. Due to the isolation being practiced in this household, there is low risk to the community from these new cases and the community risk level will not be raised at this time.

In instances of community spread, it is HIGHLY important that the community:

- **Adhere to the face covering mandate. Businesses are requested to strictly adhere to the face covering mandate to help protect their employees and patrons**
- **Practice social distancing to curb the spread of the virus**
- **Continue efforts to maintain excellent hand washing habits**
